On 21st September, in our 25th anniversary year, the new Medici Venus statue carved by Andrian Melka and sponsored by the Friends was fixed on top of the Doric Column in Chiswick House Gardens.

The Chairman of the Friends, George Nissen, said "We are immensely proud to be making our own special mark on the Restoration Project. I hope that the new statue of Venus will be a landmark symbol for the Friends, and will encourage everyone in our future efforts for these much-loved Gardens and House."

Chiswick House and Gardens Trust is Recruiting Volunteers

Volunteers play an important part at Chiswick House and Gardens whether as Tour Guides bringing the villa to life, as Goosefoot Volunteers taming neglected areas of the gardens or as Kitchen Gardeners providing a wonderful community resource in the walled garden. And once the Trust takes on the overall management of this unique site in 2010, new possibilities will open up.

New Areas for Volunteering

We are planning to have a series of volunteer teams including Garden Guides, Conservatory Stewards, Volunteer Wardens, Education Activity Supporters and Events Volunteers.

Chiswick House Tour Guides: Groups come from across the country and abroad to enjoy and learn more about Burlington's famous villa, later enjoyed by the society siren Georgiana Duchess of Devonshire and throughout the centuries as the venue for fabulous parties. Our Tour Guides share a love of history and the ability to engage a wide variety of audiences in an entertaining and lively manner.

Garden Guides: To complement tours of the house we are now seeking enthusiastic guides to conduct groups in the gardens. The completion of the Restoration Project will lead to a surge of interest in what is regarded as 'the birth place of the English Landscape Garden'. You do not need to be a horticulturalist to provide a garden tour, as for many groups the story of the gardens and the people who influenced them will be uppermost.

Goosefoots: This well-established group currently undertake a wide range of conservation and woodland tasks including coppicing, dead-hedging and clearing brambles. Next year there will be exciting new opportunities to garden in the Italian Garden, Camellia Shrubbery and Rosary. There is currently a waiting list to join the happy band of Goosefoot volunteers and this is being reviewed in February 2010.

Conservatory Stewards: The restored conservatory will be a major visitor attraction open from February when the camellias will be most abundant and through to the end of October with additional displays of flowers and produce. Working in pairs, volunteers will welcome and talk to the public as well as ensuring the plants and building are respected.

Volunteer Wardens: This would suit anyone who enjoys being outdoors, is interested in the ecology and wildlife of the gardens, likes people and wants to help ensure that visitors both enjoy the park and also respect its precious environment. Tasks will range from collecting litter to monitoring and recording species, responding to public queries and checking and reporting graffiti or damage.

Kitchen Gardeners: The Chiswick House Kitchen Garden charity's pioneering community project within the walled gardens is set to continue as a core part of Chiswick House and Gardens Trust Volunteer Service. Whether you are enthusiastic and knowledgeable about growing food and would enjoy helping others including school children to benefit from these skills, or you would simply like to 'dig, pot, weed and learn', we would love to hear from you.

Education Activity Supporters: Simrit Mann has recently been appointed as CHGT Education and Outreach Officer, partly funded by the Friends. She has exciting plans afoot for school sessions in the House and Gardens ranging from Victorian children's gardener workshops to nature trails, costumed activities in the villa and hands on archaeology. If you have an educational background you may like to help with school visits on a regular basis; there are also interesting opportunities for behind the scenes research and preparation from information gathering to costume making.

Events Volunteers: We are developing an exciting and high profile events programme for 2010 including outdoor film and theatre, a fete champetre and food lover events.
